SAFFRON WALDEN AND VILLAGES TEAM MINISTRY PRAYERS FOR SUNDAY 14 JUNE 2020 (TRINITY 1)

Since Advent, we have followed Jesus's life, death and resurrection: and have celebrated his Ascension, the coming of the Spirit at Pentecost, and the wonder of God as Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In this second half of the Christian year, the focus changes to our own lives: our readings and prayers challenge us to think how we can follow the way of Jesus Christ. Today's themes are endurance and going out to do his work in the world – perhaps very appropriate as we hope that we may gradually come out of lockdown! You might like to light a candle at home while you use this leaflet, symbolising Jesus as the Light of the World: and to say the prayers and readings out loud.

Introduction

We gather together, united in purpose though separate in place, in the name of God, our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer.

We say together (or why not sing!) an opening hymn:

Father, hear the prayer we offer: not for ease that prayer shall be, but for strength, that we may ever live our lives courageously.

Not for ever in green pastures do we ask our way to be; but the steep and rugged pathway may we tread rejoicingly. Not for ever by still waters would we idly rest and stay; but would smite the living fountains from the rocks along our way.

Be our strength in hours of weakness,

The Lord is here. His Spirit is with us.

We have come together as the family of God in this community. And especially today we thank you, Father, for giving us strength and courage to do your work in your world. Help us to pray to you in faith, to sing your praise with gratitude, and to listen to your word with eagerness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Reflection If you are using this prayer sheet privately, you may wish to read the Reflection on the Grapevine. In a moment of quiet, think what message this may have for you, and ask God to help you live it out in your life this week.

As you say this, hold in your mind all who are joining in these prayers today.

If you are joining the Eucharist celebrated live via Zoom, do follow the priest saying the Eucharistic prayer, with the standard responses. While only the priest can physically receive the consecrated bread and wine, all will be invited to say this prayer of Spiritual Communion, inviting Jesus to enter your deepest being.

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer Let us pray together as Jesus has taught us Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

We ask God's grace for the week ahead

Heavenly Father, sustain us in our joys and in our anxieties. Enfold us in your peace in our waking and in our sleeping, and may we know your presence with us now and always: in the name of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen**.

We say (or sing!) a final hymn:
All my hope on God is founded;
He doth still my trust renew.
Me through change and chance he guideth,
Only good and only true.
God unknown, he alone
Calls my heart to be his own.
